Faculty Support

Support for faculty on a variety of levels—from lectureships and fellowships to endowed professorships and chairs—enables the college to hire and retain experts in key public health fields. Such funding also fosters public health teaching and research that benefit the community at the state, national, and international levels.

Endowed faculty positions—including the deanship, chairs and professorships—are awarded to distinguished faculty members in recognition of outstanding achievements in their academic discipline. Endowed positions enhance the stature and reputation of the institution, promote greater visibility for a specific field of study, and provide long-term financial stability, including support for a faculty member’s teaching, research, and service initiatives.

Named faculty positions will help to advance the college’s academic and research missions in strategic areas of public health, including:
